

RESOLUTION NO. 1225

A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR "CASEY'S LAW" AS WRITTEN AND PRESENTED TO THE COMMISSION BOARD OF ATCHISON COUNTY, KANSAS.

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Commission Board of Atchison County, Kansas, does unanimously support "Casey's Law" as written by Dennis and Linda Beaver to be presented to Senator Barnett of Emporia, Kansas; for presentation to various committees for further action.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED; that the Governing Body of the Commission Board of Atchison County, Kansas, hereby supports the following statements as written in "Casey's Law", and feels that this law would be a step in the right direction.

1st offense operating under the influence conviction: A court may order the vehicle they were driving immobilized for up to 6 months and their license automatically suspended for 30 days and restricted for 5 months.

2nd offense drunk driving: The arresting officer will confiscate the metal license plate and issue a temporary paper license plate, and if convicted; the car will be immobilized for six months to a year and the driver's license will be revoked for one year.

3rd conviction for drunk driving: The car will be immobilized for one to three years and the license will be revoked for five years.

If the vehicle being driven does not belong to the driver, the metal license plate will still be confiscated. And, if it can be proven the owner knowingly lent the driver the vehicle, the vehicle could be immobilized.




A 2nd conviction for driving on a suspended license will result in a six-month immobilization, for a third conviction the vehicle will be immobilized for one to three years. For any additional convictions, the vehicle will be seized and sold.

It shall also be illegal to transfer the title to a family member to avoid immobilization.


